Mayor's Musings – March 2025

My second term as Mayor has gone as quickly as my first. I continue to be amazed how well our community works together with all the societies and volunteers providing a rich tapestry of activity. Our councillors have continued to oversee the business of the Town. The clean-up Southwold initiative in October was very successful and this will be followed up in the Spring. The Christmas Lights committee again organised the excellent event in November which was well supported. The Rotary Club has been very active and organised a very successful swim on Christmas day raising money for a range of organisations. I would recommend you attend the Arts Centre which has recently reopened after a major refurbishment including a new ceiling. Their programmes are very varied and are attracting large audiences from across the region.

The Tourist Information Centre is fully operational and open at Craftco. The Town Council will be developing its website to attract visitors and keep locals up to date with events www.visitsouthwold.com

The Town Council has been very active with the National Energy Projects and are pleased the Lionlink project will not be coming onshore North of the Pier. However, it is important all residents are aware of the implications of Sizewell C, Sealink and other infrastructure projects and the potential harm they can do to our community. The next major project for the Council is to understand the implications of the Devolution decision. Suffolk and Norfolk must put in their business plans by September 2025 to influence how the local government will be organised. Watch this space.

One of the highlights of the last 2 years is the improvement to our roads. Firstly, York Road was resurfaced, followed by Pier Avenue, Park Lane, East Street, Ferry Road, and Mill Lane.There are still roads with potholes and uneven surfaces, but these can be reported by individuals on the Suffolk County Highways tool. The Roads Committee are still committed to bringing in 20mph along the High Street with calming measures. There are proposals to improve signage around the Town.

I am looking forward to a range of events this year. The Mayor's Charity Concert on Friday 2nd May at St Edmunds Church is to showcase local musicians and to raise money for the Music Trust charity that supports Southwold Primary School. The Epic Half Marathon run on 2nd March which was very successful. There are many events to look forward to including the Roubaix cycle event on 13th April, Dog Show on 19th April to raise money for Ukraine, the Lions Fete on 25th May, the Arts and Street Festival on 21st June and another Harbour Festival on 28th June. The Summer Theatre will start in July.

Issued with this Newsletter is a separate document titled Southwold Town Council's strategy which identifies the Council's objectives for future years. Your comments will be welcome.

Town Council Strategic Plan & Budget for 2025-27

Residents have received a separate brochure outlining the Town Council's strategic priorities for the next two years, along with details of the budget required to complete these projects. As well as our own strategic priorities, we collaborate with other councils such as Reydon and Walberswick on improving and protecting the local environment.

Town Council Assets & Property

In addition to our strategic projects, the Town Council is responsible for maintaining a variety of assets and properties across Southwold, including:

- Residential Properties: 10 units
- Commercial Properties: 12 units
- Public Facilities:
 - Kilcock Cliff toilets
 - Southwold Market
 - The Marshes
 - The Town Pump
 - The Town Hall
 - Numerous memorial benches
 - Various litter and grit bins
 - Wayfaring signs throughout the town
 - Two play areas with gym equipment and a skatepark
 - Gardens at Electricity Green, Ferry Road and Mights Road


Rental income which we receive from our properties is reinvested into maintaining all of these assets, ensuring they remain in good condition for the community.


As well as looking after our own assets we work with other stakeholders, who maintain assets in the town, such as East Suffolk Council who look after the greens, and the Harbour Management Committee who look after the Harbour and surrounds.

Upcoming Major Projects for 2025 - 2026

Following the successful completion of the Enterprise Hub at Station Road last year, the Council's next large-scale project will focus on improving the gable end at the rear of the shops and flats on Station Road. This project will provide additional storage and toilet facilities, as well as reinforcing the gable wall. Quotes are currently being sought for the work.

Additionally, we are exploring ways to enhance community accessibility and usability of the Grade II-listed Town Hall. Plans include installing a lift and upgrading the kitchen and toilet facilities. A planning application for these improvements has recently been approved by East Suffolk Council, and we are now considering a phased approach for the work.
